Motion to accept treasurer report and pay all bills made by Richard Dries seconded by George Heflich, Sr. Motion carried. On Oct. 15, 2019 the books were audited and found to be correct.

Special Guest: Joseph T. Hankins, VP/NJSFA mentioned that they are trying to change the law dealing with age for firefighters to get into relief from 45 to 57 years of age. Also, a change in Death Benefit Fund which results in lower coverage in the beginning until reaching 84 months in good standings.

Communication & Correspondence (1) Audit was completed and found good standings. (2) This organization received \$40.00 Grant check from Network for Good, which will be deposited.

Committee Reports: Director NVFC George H. Heflich, Sr gave the following report:

- (1) October NVFC Meeting in Georgia with 39 states and 61 Directors attended. To be appointed as a Director must be active Volunteer firefighter or paid on call for 5 or more years. NVFC amended bylaws article 6 "No person who has been convicted of a felony or crime involving Fire or Explosives may be appointed as a Director to the NVFC"
- (2) George mentioned that Corporate Sponsorship, Josh Cellars donated \$163,000 to the Volunteer Support Fund and Jack Daniels held an event for Volunteers in Tennessee, Anheuser Bush donated 1.4 million cans of water, they committed to only 1 million cans.
- (3)The NVFC received a 2-year Federal Grant to Fund a behavioral health project and another Federal Grant for the Forest Service with agreement to update the Recruitment and retention program. NVFC will be holding a recruitment and Retention Experience in Cleveland, Ohio on Sept. 25-26, 2020.
- (4)It was mentioned that United States Fire Service is facing their biggest challenge, fighting and Stopping Cancer, 14% more deaths are expected, 9% more digamous, Skin Urinary, and oral Cancers. Out of the 65% of Volunteers, rural areas 48% 20% are minorities and 5 to 10% females. Health on the Fire Scene Monitor how long body temperature, Heart Rate. Check all old Foam.
- (5) For the Seminar Dinner we were bused to Harlem, Georgia for supper, supper was Grots, Eggs, Bacon Sausage and Corn Bread. Harlem is the home of Laurel and Hardy. I met the Mayor who was a woman and I explained to her about the Real Harlem, NY. Their police department had five Vehicles. NFVC approved funds for a firefighter who lost their home due to fire. The Fall Meeting 2023 will be held at Cooperstown, NY hosted by the NY Firemen's Association.
- (6) I am on the Recruitment and Retention Committee, and at the meeting they are putting an ad that will run for one minute every flight with United airlines for the month of December at a cost of \$100,000.00. George explained to the committee a problem in Secaucus, NJ with a fighter's son, who was one of twelve Junior Fighters and a member of the NVFC Junior Fighters Program. The Junior Fighter is Firefighter One Certified and has incident Management System 100, 200, 300, 400, 700 and 800. Members of my fire company acted as idols towards him and as a result he left our company and went with another.

Committee Reports: Brian Foley, NJ 2nd Director NVFC Report:

- (1) Training Summit: registration is now open for the NVFC Training Summit, which will take place June 26, 2020 in Orlando, FL.
- (2) Membership Meeting: The NVFC is hosting its annual membership meeting by webinar on March 14, 2020 at 3 pm.

- 4. A491: Enhances PFRS accidental death pension to surviving spouse by providing for a minimum of \$50,000 annually.
- 5. A306: Immunizes from civil liability first responders who forcibly enter property to provide emergency assistance.

Legislative Committee: New Jersey Firemen's Association-Legislative Committee reported tracking a total of 10 bills pending.
