North Carolina has the largest number of members in the Council, 50,000

There were 14 Directors or Chiefs from New England to Delaware the rest were from out west

Hometown Heroes Act pays 343,000 there are 398 cases pending 61 Heart Attack or Stroke,29 from Sept. 11 Exposure, 144 actives from Injuries, Traumatic death act. The rest are pending because of Neglect, Late filing

Autopsy or Topology Reports are not necessary unless there is a question on filling out the forms

They had a seminar on running a meeting with Planning, Running, Effeteness, Ground Rules, I explained to him that I ran a meeting every year at our Convention and we hold comments to the last day and we get 20 to 25 firefighters ask Questions 20 % are good the rest they will not like your answer.

They are working on H.R.2, the Nutrition Act of 2018, it a bill to create a Fire Safe cigarette to have a reduced propensity that it will not burn when left unattended

Drug problem out in Kentucky, West Virginia and neighboring States out of control, week before seminar West Virginia had 27 Opium o On May 10<sup>th</sup>, 2018 the Senate approved by unanimous consent HR 931 the firefighter Cancer registry Bill has to go back to the house for final passage, to improve research collection activities related to the monitoring of cancer among firefighters

Hand out to help reducing exposure to Cancer for Firefighters in the front r opioids or heroin deaths in 4 Hours. In those states there are no jobs, coal mines are closed, and all the older coal miners are beat up and rely on those drugs for pain, Fire Department responds to all those calls.

They said that when you revive these people with No can they usually wake up and want to fight

They started a Firefighters Cancer Alliance, 11 Reasons to stop Cancer the results of that study will be complete in August

280 Firefighters committed suicide last year both career and Volunteer, that they have a record of. Military personal that got of the service that saw combat and had issues that were never taken care of, Stress, Injuries, or Firefighters or Officers that made bad decisions.

The Firefighter that went around the country talking to individuals who said they wanted to commit suicide had to get Counseling for himself after 5 years. He then asked Answer me what would you do if your best friend or brother firefighter came up to you and said I want to kill myself. What would you do or say. I am trying to get guidelines on what to say or do if you are faced with that problem, there are card up front to call a help line.

That same problem is with the Police at the 200-club luncheon. Wayne Blanchard President of the State Troopers Fraternal Association spoke on that problem, I spoke to him later and he forwarded to me a place and phone # of a facility in N J to call, I will ask the Chief if he can put it on line with the minutes

Active shooting, they are getting trained how to use Tounkites and when the police take you in when hopefully its safe to work with them and the police they find most victims are bleeding out

Deacon at the scene is easy if its nice weather, not freezing and have to know where the run off is going Chief in Massachusetts had to put a holding tank in to catch the run off because there are all septic tanks in the area so they have to pump out the holding tank and take it to a sewerage plant an hour away, also where they are located the firefighter who came in their cars may be a problem, is the F D responsible, they were also talking about the seats and interior of the cab be made that they can hose that down also, How many times can the gear be cleaned, they came up with a figure of 10 times.

New Jersey Firemen's Association – (a) New Applications for 2018 are in place for relief to members. It spells out what NEED is and what can be used and what cannot be used for relief. Effective July 1, 2018 the death benefit goes up to \$11,750.00. In January 1, 2019 Home Care will increase from \$600 to \$700 per month.

NVFC Dispatch: Fire Police Fairness Act introduced and reported by Richard Dries: The Legislation clarifying that Fire Police is Public Safety Officers. May 15, 2018 Senator Richard Blumenthal (D-CT) & Patrick Toomey (R-PA) introduced S. 2871, the Fire Police Fairness Act & is identical to H.R. 3918. The Act establishes "fire police officer" as a new category of public safety officer, defined as an individual who, is serving in accordance with State or local law as an officially recognized or designated member of a legally organized public safety agency... and provides scene security or directs traffic in response to any fire drill, fire call, or other fire, rescue, or police emergency. https://www.nvfc.org/legislation-introduced-clarifying-that-fire-police-are-public-safety-officers/

- 1. Acting director Louis Kilmer reported on **new Fire code. 2015 edition** has been adopted and will start being enforced by July 1, 2018. Money has been set aside for training.
  - A. 10 year sealed battery smoke alarms and pictographs on propane tanks
  - b. Changes to Subchapter 2 and 4 went into effect upon adoption of new code.
  - c. New fireworks regulations based on NFPA 1124. Type 2 permits will be required for storage of over 125 Lbs

**New Jersey Fire Museum** – No report and no answer about sharing table at convention.

**Legislative Committee:** Out of 98 Bills pertaining to firemanic only four had action. (1) **A1675** authorizing prescribed burning in certain circumstances. Passed house needs 2<sup>nd</sup> heading (2) **A3671 & S5** Transfers management of PFRS to Board of Trustees of PFRS is at Governor to sign. (3) **S1492:** 2<sup>nd</sup> reading "**Assistance to Firefighters Families Act". (4) S376:** Eliminates eligibility time limit on tuition benefits for spouses of certain public safety workers killed in performance of their duties.
